Capital Plans Underway

If you read the June issue of this newsletter or attended any of the past couple of general club meetings, you are aware of the Capital Plans for WRPC. The work has begun!

The pad for the firing line on rifle range is completed. Next up will probably be the new steel roof on the clubhouse and/or the drainage project down both sides of the clubhouse along with a new steel rear door. The remaining work including the completion of the firing line on the rifle range will be spread out over the next 4-5 years. The Clubhouse expansion discussion is not dead, but was sleeping and been awakened.

Keep in mind that all our facilities have been around for quite a while with minimal maintenance, a somewhat small membership and limited finances. As our membership continues to grow and our shooting events providing a mediocre income stream; we have always budgeted wisely. The BoD feels now is the time to act on the much needed repairs.

These upgrades will consume quite a bit of money. Although our membership continues to grow (the membership cap has been raised to 300) at a slow and steady pace, and our monthly shooting events place a small to modest amount into Club coffers over the course of each year. The bonus is our gun raffle. Over the past 10 years (has it been that long?) with our members help in selling the raffle tickets, we have put about \$100K into our accounts; but our yearly bills take a nice chunk out of all that is gained. If we were to work on all projects immediately, our treasury would almost be depleted, hence the 5-year plan.

Remember that material and labor costs continue to rise (have ya gone shopping for anything lately?). The BoD has mentioned a possible small increase in yearly dues - this is only a fleeting thought at this point! With the exception of any of the major projects, we as the Club membership will need to step up and work on the smaller projects to keep costs down. Experience is nice but not necessary; if you can swing a hammer, use a paintbrush, and an hour or two or three to donate to your gun club...

Bullseye Shooting

In Bullseye Pistol we do not wear fancy costumes from a bygone era with our guns tied down, like the Cowboy Action shooters. Nor do we move from cover to cover to engage bad guy targets.

In this shooting sport the only thing we focus on is hitting the target in the time provided.

The three courses of fire in Bullseye Pistol are Slow, Timed and Rapid.

Slow Fire consists of firing 10 shots in 10 minutes.

Lots of time to focus on sight picture, trigger control, and all the other items that help you miss.

Timed Fire, 2 strings of 5 shots each with 20 seconds for each string. Still enough time to think about what you should be doing, but not enough time to over think it.

Rapid Fire, 2 strings of 5 shots each with 10 seconds for each string. Muscle memory will help you here, if your muscles remembered the right things.

So if you want to improve your ability to hit what you are shooting at, or you just like the sound of guns. Join us for Bullseye Pistol, Thursdays at 7 pm.

Also, if you would like to help your fellow shooters by painting the plates after you use them, use only the paint provided either white or yellow. Paint is not provided during the cold weather but is only \$.99 at Wal Mart

Keep in mind that not all the steel targets on our ranges are made for high powered rifles/shotguns. The bottom line is...if you're not sure - don't take the shot!!

There's a clear plastic box with some orange things in it situated below the "Range Clear/Shooter Downrange" sign on the rifle range. To clear the mystery...they're safety vests to be worn when you go downrange. Don't take the chance when setting targets! Keep yourself safe by making yourself clearly visible.
